Mark: My Words

Mark is a book of accurate history, theological insight and literary brilliance. This educational but interactive programme explores the background to Mark's Gospel, as well as its historical context, structure and main themes. You won't see Mark's Gospel in the same way again!

Life and Legacy: St. Patrick

Referencing two of his works, this programme explores St. Patrick's upbringing and his life, the background to his writings and even looks into the texts themselves.

Counter-Cultural

In 'Counter-Cultural', we compare the moral teaching found in the Decalogue (Exodus 20) to that of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). Considering the similarities and differences, we follow with discussion as to how these passages can inform our moral decision making today.

Living Letters

Where did the Bible come from, why is it so important and how can we read it effectively? This programme examines the origin of the Bible, its content and teaches young people how to read it for themselves.

Problem of Pain

If God is real, and if He is good, then why is there so much evil and suffering in the world? This programme addresses 'the problem of pain' and explores whether or not a good and powerful God could possibly exist in light of the evil and suffering we see around us.

Kingdom Stories: The Good Samaritan

Jesus often used stories to teach people about the Kingdom of God. One such story is The Parable of the Good Samaritan. In this RE lesson, we study what the parable says and consider its meaning.

Kingdom Stories: The Prodigal Son

Part of our 'Kingdom Stories' series, this programme

examines The Parable of the Prodigal Son. Using discussion, we look at the story and reflect on how it applies to our lives today.

Prove it!

In this courtroom-style, interactive programme, we encourage pupils to ask questions, raise objections and to hear the arguments for and against the most pivotal event in history: the resurrection of Jesus.

Persecution

Persecution is not just a historical fact; it is a modern-day reality for countless Christians around the world. Through personal testimonies and in-depth case studies of specific nations, we consider the reality of Christians who suffer for their faith.

Why RE?

Historically, Christianity has significantly influenced and shaped the world in which we live. This programme will explore both the positive aspects of such influence and the challenges faced by Christianity. Additionally, we will examine the origins of Christianity and the historical evidence of Jesus, concluding with an exploration of what it means to be a true follower of Jesus.

It's a Miracle

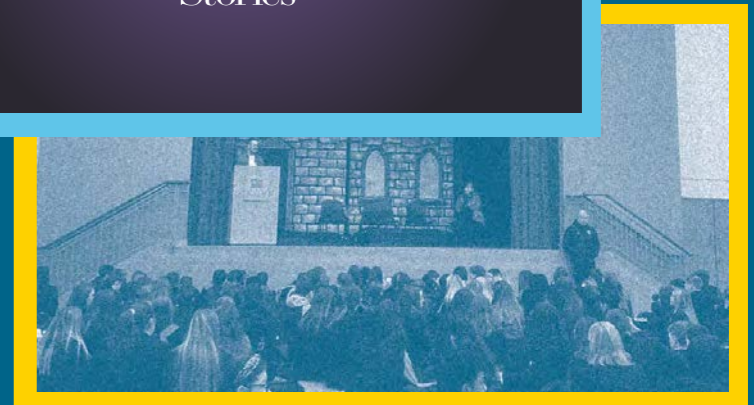
Jesus performed many miracles during His ministry on earth. What do they tell us about Him, and what can we learn from them?
